Our First Playground!



"A majority of our soldiers live and work in the local community," said Sergeant Jim Zemanick. "It's a great opportunity for us to give back."

We received a sizeable grant from the Conrad and Virginia Klee Foundation to build a playground at the Club, and, over three days this summer, the National Guard's 204th Engineering Battalion constructed the playground for our local youth.



The Club saved thousands of dollars thanks to the skill and generosity of the National Guard. During our annual dinner in October, we presented Sergeant Zemanick with an appreciation award for the Guard's phenomenal work on the construction of the playground in our new outdoor play space.



Bids for Kids 2011

On December 1, we held our 19th annual Bids for Kids live and silent auction at the Riverwalk Hotel. Over 100 silent auction items and 23 live auction items went home with the highest bidder. A one-week stay in Keystone, Colorado, brought in the largest winning bid at \$1,350. The auction raised over \$24,000 for our Club programming.

This year we celebrated several exciting achievements, which you'll learn about throughout this newsletter. We also welcomed six new board members, including Santo Caracciolo, Tom Jackson, Patrick May, Dr. Samuel Pejo, Jerome Scott, and Father Corey Van Kuren.

In addition to generous donations from businesses in our community, we received thousands of dollars in grants from foundations like AT&T, Charles Schwab, Conrad and Virginia Klee, M&T, Newman's Own, and Taco Bell, as well as grants from local companies and organizations, including Binghamton Sertoma Club, Broome County Arts Council United Cultural Fund, HSBC, and United Way.

Through a grant from the Taco Bell Foundation for Teens, our members attended eight college preparation workshops, heard from six guest speakers about college admissions and campus life, and attended six college tours to SUNY Binghamton, Broome Community College, SUNY Cortland, Hartwick College, SUNY Oneonta, and Syracuse University.



A grant from the Broome County Arts Council United Cultural Fund enabled us to offer our members a six-week drama program, led by a professional actor and director, that culminated in a Community Arts Carnival hosted by the Club.

We had the largest audience since the drama program's inception six years ago, and our partnership with Binghamton University enhanced the

carnival, as over 10 student groups provided entertainment for the event ranging from singing and acrobatics to puppet making and mini golf.



In November we celebrated Thanksgiving at the Club with a dinner attended by 225 youth members, and later this month we'll receive a visit from Santa at our annual holiday party for the kids.

Our Club has had a wonderful year, and we're looking forward to offering more enriching programming in 2012.
